## Advising Guide and Degree Checklist B.A./B.S. in Art, Option: Studio Arts

## Art: Program Overview

OSU-Cascades Campus offers a Bachelor of Arts (BA) or a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree with an option in Studio Art. The curriculum provides an awareness and understanding of the historical and contemporary significance of art as a unique feature of society.

The OSU-Cascades Art program offers the opportunity for professional artistic development while incorporating subjects that lead to a liberal education. These major programs prepare the student for a range of professional opportunities or later graduate study in graphic design, advertising, communications, photography, fine art, art history and teaching.

To complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS) in Art, Option Studio Arts students must complete the following degree requirements:

- OSU Graduation Requirements
- Baccalaureate Core
- College of Liberal Arts Core
- BA or BS Requirements
- Art: Studio Arts Major Requirements - C- or better required in all major requirements


## OSU Graduation Requirements

Students pursuing a degree at OSU must meet the following requirements in addition to program and college requirements.

- 180 minimum credits required to graduate $=$
- 60 minimum upper division credits =
- 135 max number of transfer credits applied to OSU degree.
- 45 of last 75 credits must be OSU credits.
- Maintain a 2.0 or better university GPA.

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## Baccalaureate Core Requirements (Bacc Core)

Complete all Bacc Core using the OSU-Cascades Bacc Core course guide. Students who have an AAOT have all Skills and Perspectives completed. Courses can double count in Bacc Core, CLA Core and Major, but not apply in all three areas.
