HDFS Human Services Option

In the HDFS program, you'll address human development across the lifespan and gain the knowledge and skills you need to help improve the human condition. This may include intervening during crises, preventing future crises, helping people access resources, and advocating for changes in the systems that affect the lives of those in need. You can also focus on supporting young children and their families in early childhood settings.

Few careers offer as many opportunities to directly and profoundly impact lives. With an HDFS degree, you'll be ready for professional work or graduate study in fields such as education, HDFS, social work or public administration.

The Human Services profession is dedicated to improving the human condition by intervening during crises, preventing future crises, helping people access resources and advocating for change in the systems that affect the lives of those in need. The primary purpose of Human Services is to empower individuals, families and communities to survive, function and thrive, even in the face of adversity. A strength-based philosophy, recognizing the importance of physical, mental and psychological wellness and prevention underpins the multidisciplinary approach of the Human Services option.

Coursework includes family relationships, human development across the lifespan, proposal writing, ethics and human services foundations skills.

HDFS MAJOR Requirements:

- OSU Graduation Requirements
- Baccalaureate Core
- HDFS Major & Option Coursework
- All courses required within the major must be completed with a grade of C- or higher.
- First attempt may be completed as S/U grading but must retake for a grade in second attempt.

Oregon State University Graduation Requirements:

- 60 number of upper division credits required (300-400 level courses)
- 135 Maximum number of transfer credits
- 45 out of last 75 credits must be completed through OSU credits.
- Maintain a 2.0 or better university GPA
- Max 18 course withdraws (W grade)
- Max 11 credits in PAC (Physical Activity Coursework)
