 - B. MTH 111 and MTH 245 (8 credits) and Bacc Core math
 - C. MTH 241 or MTH245 or MTH251, and ST 351 (8 credits) and Bacc Core math
 - D. Any 8 credits of MTH depart courses at the 200 level or above (**not including MTH 243 and MTH 244 at COCC**) and Bacc Core math
