Liberal Studies: Program Overview

The liberal studies major allows students to design their own plan of study organized around a theme. This theme is unique to each student and intended to support their academic interests, personal and career goals. This interdisciplinary approach provides greater breadth and flexibility than can be found in other majors. Students mix and match courses from the following OSU-Cascades departments: American studies, anthropology, art, English, communication, political science, psychology, new media communication, Spanish, sociology, and writing.

- Students completing an AAOT should use this guide to select classes in AAOT and Major.
- Applying for the COCC/OSU degree partnership program (DPP) allows students to begin OSU coursework while completing COCC courses. DPP students receive advising at OSU.

1 computer science (CS) course approved by the student's advisor (3-4 cr)	Samples: CIS 120, CIS 122, CIS 125G and CIS 131
1 course from the College of Science except math or statistics (3-4 credits)	Depts – BI, CH, G, GEOG, GS, PH
One of the following MTH/ST combination (2 courses): Any 200 level Math or Stats courses	Math in B.Sci section cannot double count in Bacc Core Math.
